Some very significant events happened in the month of October for the U.S. Submarine service and with Boat Notes.

In October, significant events in submarine history include the commissioning of the U.S.



Navy's first submarine, the U.S.S. Holland, on October 12, 1900, and the establishment of the submarine base at New London, Connecticut, in 1915.

On Oct. 18, 1915, the US Navy submarines G-1, G-2, G-4, and the tender USS Ozark arrive at Naval Base New London on the Thames River in Groton, Conn.

USS Blueback (SS-581)

USS Blueback (SS-581) is a Barbel-class submarine that served in the United States Navy from 1959 to 1990. She was the second Navy submarine to bear the name. Blueback was laid down by Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation of Pascagoula, Mississippi on 15 April 1957. She was launched on 16 May 1959 nd commissioned on 15 October 1959, Lieutenant Commander Robert H. Gautier in command. She was the last non-nuclear submarine to join the United States Navy and was the final conventionally powered combat capable submarine.

Lost Boats – October



officers and men and 17 US Army troops when she was sunk just north of Moritai by USS Rowell, a Destroyer Escort (DE). In this tragic error, Rowell mistook Seawolf for a Japanese submarine that had just sunk

another Destroyer. Seawolf ranks 7th for enemy ships sunk.

Lost on Oct 3,1944, with the loss of 83

5-44 SS-155	USS S-44 (SS-155)	Lost on Oct 7, 1943, with the loss of 56 men when it was sunk off Paramushiru, Kuriles. S-44 was on her 5th war patrol after attacking a target thought to be a merchant on the surface, S-44 found herself in a losing gun battle with a heavily armed Japanese destroyer. Two men were taken prisoner and survived the war.
U.S.S. WAHOO SS-238	USS Wahoo (SS-238)	Lost on Oct 11, 1943, with the loss of 80 men near La Perouse Strait. Under command of one of the great sub skippers of World War II, LCDR "Mush" Morton, Wahoo was on her 7th war patrol. Wahoo had won a Presidential Unit Citation and ranks 5th in the number of enemy ships sunk. She was lost to depth charges dropped by a Japanese patrol aircraft.
USS DORADO	USS Dorado (SS-248)	Lost on Oct 12, 1943, with the loss of 77 men when she was sunk in the western Atlantic near Cuba. Newly commissioned, she had departed New London and was enroute to Panama. She may have been sunk by a U.S. patrol plane that received faulty instructions regarding bombing restriction areas or a German U-boat that was in the vicinity.
SS-294	USS Escolar (SS-294)	Lost on Oct 17, 1944, with the loss of 82 men. She was on her 1st war patrol and was most likely lost to a mine somewhere in the Yellow Sea.
SS-31A	USS Shark II (SS-314)	Lost on Oct 24,1944, with the loss of 87 men when she was sunk near Hainan. The second boat to carry this name during World War II, she was on her 3rd war patrol. Shark was sunk by escorts after attacking and sinking a lone freighter. Compounding the tragedy, it turned out that the freighter had 1,800 U.S. POWs on board.

SS DARTER SC. 23	USS Darter (SS-227)	Lost on Oct 24, 1944, when she became grounded on Bombay Shoal off Palawan and was then destroyed to prevent her falling into enemy hands intact. The entire crew was rescued by USS Dace. Winner of one Navy Unit Commendation, Darter had sunk a heavy cruiser and damaged another and went aground while attempting an "end around" on an enemy formation in hopes of getting in an attack on a battleship.
TANG	USS Tang (SS-306)	Lost on Oct 25,1944, with the loss of 78 men in the Formosa Strait. Tang was on her 5th war patrol. Tang ranks 2nd in the number of ships sunk and 4th in tonnage and had won two Presidential Unit Citations. During a daring night surface attack, Tang was lost to a circular run by one of her own torpedoes. Nine of the crew were taken prisoner, including CDR. O'Kane and five who had reached the surface from her final resting place 180 feet below. All survived the war, and CDR O'Kane was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.
	USS O-5 (SS-66)	Lost on October 29, 1923, with the loss of 3 men when rammed and sunk by SS Abangarez off the Panama Canal.

Basic Enlisted Submarine School (BESS) Updates

During each month, a USSVI Groton Base member participated in Basic Enlisted Submarine School (BESS) graduation as the SubVets Representative presenting the "Heritage Award" and a SubVet Challenge coin to the class leader. In this month's issue of Boat Notes, we will highlight two graduations held on 5th & 19th of September. I would like to thank SubSchool leadership, CO Captain Chance Litton, and CMC Michael Micheli, Senior Chief David Lee, class instructors and coordinators, for allowing us to participate in this milestone event.

The following information is for BESS Class 25400, named after the USS Finback SS 230. The information provided comes from various sources including Naval History and Heritage Command and Wikipedia. Follow the links below for additional details.

USS Finback (SS-230), a Gato-class submarine, was the first ship of the United States Navy to be named for the finback. Nine of Finback's twelve World War II patrols in the Pacific were designated as "successful"; she received 13 battle stars for her service and is credited with having sunk nearly 70 thousand tons of enemy shipping.

Finback was laid down on 5 February 1941 at the Portsmouth Navy Yard in Kittery, Maine. She was launched on 25 August 1941 and sponsored by Mrs. Genevieve G. Watson, wife of Rear Admiral Adolphus E Watson, Commandant of the 4th Naval District and the Philadelphia Navy Yard in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She was commissioned on 31 January 1942.

During her ninth war patrol off the Palaus and west of the Marianas, Finback was once again assigned lifeguard duty during aircraft strikes covering the opening of the Marianas operation. She returned to Majuro 21 July 1944, then steamed to the Iwo Jima, ChiChi Jima, and HaHa Jima area of operations near the Bonin Islands where she was assigned lifeguard duty on her tenth war patrol. Finback's crew rescued multiple downed pilots during some of the heaviest fighting of the war. One of the fortunate aviators rescued was

Lieutenant (j.g.) George H.W. Bush who would go on to become the 41st president of the United States.

Homeported at New London for the remaining five years of her active career, Finback was engaged in training student submariners. Twice, in 1947 and in 1948, she sailed to the Caribbean to take part in Second Fleet exercises. She was decommissioned and placed in reserve at New London on 21 April 1950. Finback was stricken on 1 September 1958, and sold for scrap on 15 July 1959. All but the third, ninth, and twelfth of Finback's twelve war patrols were designated "successful." She received 13 battle stars for World War II service, and is credited with having sunk 69,383 tons of enemy shipping.

Congratulations to this class of future Submariners who have finished one of many milestones in their Navy career and are anxiously waiting for their next assignments whether "A" School or direct assignment to their first submarine. included were: MMAC(SS) Roberts, FT1(SS) Abbott, and STS2(SS) Ortez. Thank you for using your background, training, and experience in guiding these future Submariners.

The Command Representative was SubSchool XO, CDR Paul Danos. Guest Speaker was CMDCM Jason Hayes. SubSchool Chaplain, CDR Wilkinson gave the Invocation and Benediction.



USSVI Groton Base and Holland Club Chairman, RMCM(SS) John Carcioppolo USN (Ret) was the SubVet Representative and presented the Submarine Heritage Award and a Groton Base challenge coin to SR(SU) Aidan Reno. The Heritage Award is given to the student who demonstrates performance of their duties above and beyond the call of the average student.

The Captain William H. Purdum Award was presented by MMACS(SS) Lee to SR(SU) Ethan Tharp. This award is given to the student who demonstrates academic achievement and personal improvement through the course of instruction.



The class Honor Graduate Award was presented to SN(SU) Brianna Moraquinones by SubSchool XO, CDR Danos. The honor graduate is the student with the highest academic average who maintained outstanding military bearing over the course of instruction.

The Navy Core Values Award was presented by CMDCM Kevin Swanson to SR(SU) Garret Dingman. This award is giving to the student who best embodies the U.S. Navy Core Values of Honor, Courage, and Commitment.

On September 19th, the BESS class that graduated was named after the USS Barbero (SS-317).



USS Barbero (SS/SSA/SSG-317) was a Balao-class submarine of the United States Navy, named for a family of fishes commonly called surgeon fish. Barbero was laid down by the Electric Boat Company of Groton, Connecticut on 25 March 1943. She was launched on 12 December 1943, sponsored by Mrs. Katherine R. Keating, and commissioned on 29 April 1944.

Barbero's war operations span the period from 9 August 1944–2 January 1945, during which she completed two war patrols. She is credited with sinking three Japanese

merchant ships totaling 9,126 tons while patrolling in the Java and South China Seas.

In September 1945, she was ordered to Mare Island Naval Shipyard where she underwent pre-inactivation overhaul – and was placed in commission in reserve on 25 April 1946. On 1 February 1955, Barbero entered Mare Island Naval Shipyard for her a conversion under project SCB 118, equipping her to launch the Regulus I nuclear cruise missile. She was thus redesignated SSG-317 and recommissioned on 28 October 1955 under Lt. Cmdr. Samuel T. Bussey as the second submarine equipped with the Regulus missile, Tunny having been converted in 1953. The submarine was placed in commission, in reserve, on 9 June 1964 in preparation for inactivation and disposal. On 1 July 1964, Barbero was placed out of commission, and her name was struck from the Navy list simultaneously. She was sunk as a target on 24 October 1964.

USS Barbero received two battle stars for her service during World War II.

- 2. Work on the 3rd floor will continue in October, with scrapping old paint off one area walls, repainting
 - a. Possible relocation of items to improve area usage
- 3. Old auditorium chairs are being to be removed from attic and the intent is to get more donations.
 - a. Initial evaluation is that there is some value
 - b. I believe we don't have any use in our clubhouse for these, and it could be dangerous to keep them in the attic.
- 4. A new space to be identified on the 3rd floor for any donations that come into the club. I hope that in left in a central location we can more quickly evaluate whether or not to keep the donations. NOTE: it's extremely hard not to accept these donations from navy families; remember the items were personal belongings to their family member.

The Executive Board hopes this letter finds you well and proud of your Submarine heritage. Many wonderful things continue to be accomplished at USSVI Groton Base, and they will continue to happen throughout the years to come. Part of the USSVI Creed states "provide a way for all submariners to gather for their mutual benefit and enjoyment. Our common heritage as Submariners shall be strengthened by camaraderie. The Chapel On The Thames



The Chapel on the Thames (COT) is located aboard Naval Submarine Base New London in Groton and offers both Protestant and Roman Catholic worship services for active-duty retired veterans and their families.

The COT was originally conceived and constructed as a memorial to submariners, Officers and Enlisted who lost their lives in the service of their country during the Second World War. The COT was opened on December 3, 1944, 80 years ago and in it you will find many submarine related themes including beautiful stained-glass windows and pews labeled with brass plates to memorialize specific submarines from World War II.
