

U.S. SUBMARINES FORCES LOSSES

Bless those who served beneath the deep,
Through the lonely hours of vigil they had to keep,
May the eternal peace their mission ever be,

January



<u>USS SCORPION (SS-278)</u> Lost on Jan 5,1944 with the loss of 77 officers and men in the East China Sea, on her 4th war patrol. It is assumed she was sunk by a mine.



<u>USS ARGONAUT (APS-1/SS-166)</u> Lost on Jan 10, 1943 with the loss of 102 officers and men off Rabaul, on her 3rd war patrol. While attacking a convoy, she torpedoed a Jap destroyer who along with 2 other destroyer's depth charged her. As she tried to surface, the destroyers sunk her by gun fire.



<u>USS S-36 (SS-141)</u> Lost on Jan 20, 1942 with no loss of life, on her 2nd war patrol. She ran hard aground on a reef and radioed for help. The entire crew was rescued by a Dutch ship after they scuttled her.

<u>USS SWORDFISH (SS-193)</u> Lost on Jan 12,1945 with the loss of 89 officers and men somewhere near Okinawa, on her 13th war patrol. Probably was lost to a mine.



<u>USS S-26 (SS-131)</u> Lost on Jan 24,1942 with the loss of 46 officers and men in the Gulf of Panama, on her 2nd war patrol. She was rammed by the USS PC-460 and sunk within seconds. The CO, XO and one lookout on the bridge, were the only survivors.



U.S. SUBMARINES FORCES LOSSES (Continued)

February



<u>USS BARBEL (SS-316)</u> Lost on Feb 4,1945 with the loss of 81 officers and men on her 4th war patrol. Based on Japanese records, she was bombed near the southern entrance to the Palawan Passage. The day before, she reported she survived 3 depth charge attacks.



<u>USS SHARK I (SS-174)</u> Lost on Feb 11,1942 with the loss of 59 officers and men on her 1st war patrol. Shark was the 1st US submarine sunk by enemy surface craft in the Pacific. She was most likely sunk by depth charges.



<u>USS AMBERJACK (SS-219) Lost</u> on Feb 16,1943 with the loss of 72 officers and men on her 3rd war patrol. Off Rabaul, she was attacked by a Japanese patrol plane, attacked by a torpedo boat and then depth charged by a subchaser. One additional man was killed earlier on the last patrol.



<u>USS GRAYBACK (SS-208)</u> Lost on Feb 26,1944 with the loss of 80 officers and men on her 10th war patrol. She appears to have been caught on the surface in the East China Sea by a Japanese carrier plane whose bombs made a direct hit. During this patrol she sank 4 ships totaling 21,594 tons and was tied for 11th in the number of ships sunk.



<u>USS TROUT (SS202)</u> Lost on Feb 29,1944 with the loss of 81 officers and men on her 11th war patrol. She was sunk by escorts in the middle of the Philippines Basin after sinking a passenger-cargoman and damaging another in a convoy. She carried out several notable special missions, including carrying over two tons of gold bullion out of Corregidor in February 1942.

U.S. SUBMARINES FORCES LOSSES (Continued)

March



<u>USS PERCH (SS-176)</u> Lost on March 3,1942 near Java with no immediate loss of life, while on her 1st war patrol. She survived 2 severe depth charging in less than 200 feet of water by 3 Japanese destroyers. The crew abandoned ship and scuttled her. Of the 59 officers and men taken prisoner, 53 survived the war and six died as POWs.



<u>USS GRAMPUS (SS-207)</u> Lost on March 5,1943 with the loss of 71 officers and men, on her 6th war patrol. She was lost in Vella Gulf, sunk after engaging 2 Japanese Destroyers.



<u>USS H-1 (SS-28)</u> Lost on March 12, 1920 with the loss of 4 men as they tried to swim to shore after grounding on a shoal off Santa Margarita Island, off the coast of Baja California, Mexico. Vestal (AR-4), pulled H-1 off the rocks in the morning of 24 March, only to have her sink 45 minutes later in some 50 feet of water. She was originally named the USS SEAWOLF before becoming H-1.



<u>USS TRITON (SS-201)</u> Lost on March 15,1943 with the loss of 74 men. She was sunk north of the Admiralty Islands during a fight with 3 Japanese Destroyers. Triton was the 1st boat to engage the enemy in December 1941 off Wake Island, sinking 9 ships, 1 submarine and a destroyer.

Cold War Submariner Edward I Childs of North Stonington CT departed 11/27/2019 on Eternal Patrol. Ed Joined the USN in 1952 and retired in 1974 as EMCS(SS). He qualified in submarines in 1954 on the USS Cubera (SS-347) and also served aboard Skipjack, Nautilus, Gato and Tinosa.

Ed was a Life and Holland Club member of USSVI Groton Base.

John Dwight McElroy, ETCM(SS)
Passed away on 12/11/2019



USSVI Base: Groton Served on: DD-211, AD-14, DD-451, SS-477

Qualified in submarines on the USS Conger (SS-477) in 1953 and was a ETCM(SS) when he left the Navy.

WW2 Veteran and Cold War Submariner John Dwight McElroy, 94, of Old Lyme, died December 11, 2019, in Apple Rehabilitation in Old Saybrook. Born March 5, 1925, in Paxton, Ill., the son of John D. McElroy and Alta (Wilson) McElroy. He is predeceased by his wife Patricia Brown McElroy and son Ronald M. Smith.

He honorably served in the United States Navy for his career of 20 years, retiring in 1961, as a master chief petty officer. Mr. McElroy's naval service began with his enlistment in 1942. He served on destroyers as a torpedoman and hard hat diver. After surviving two ship sinking's due to torpedo attacks, he transferred to the US Navy submarine service and changed his rating to electronics technician.

He qualified in submarines in 1953 aboard the USS Conger (SS/AGSS-477). He later qualified for nuclear submarine service and ended his career as a ETCM(SS) nuclear program instructor at the submarine base in Groton.

Following his US Navy service, he was employed at the U.S. Navy Underwater Sound Laboratory in New London as an electronics technician until his retirement in 1981. He traveled widely while working on experimental sonar programs. He performed advanced work on Project Sanguine, a critical communication system for submarines, and did a tour as operator of the Sound Surveillance System (SOSUS) at the control station in the Azores. Following retirement from the Underwater Sound Laboratory, Mr. McElroy became a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and Antique Veterans association where he assisted in many burial services. He was a grand master mason of the Bay View Lodge #120 in Niantic, and a member of the Shriners International. Mr. McElroy is survived by his daughter Denise Goucher of Old Lyme granddaughters, Jillian Goucher and Taylor Goucher of Old Lyme and Terry Conrad Turner of Greenwich; grandson Chris A. Smith of New Hartford; his greatgrandchildren, Joshua Conrad of Juan, Calif. and Christy Conrad of Greenwich; and his great-granddaughter Tezza Conrad of Jaun, Calif.

He was a Life and Holland Club member of USSVI Groton Base.

Cold War Submariner DAVID G. FERRELL age 88 of Groton passed away with family by his side on Thursday, September 26, 2019 at Westerly Hospital.

David was born August 1, 1931 to Richard M. and Audrey Gilson Ferrell in Chelyan, W. VA., a small coal terminal town. He attended school there and graduated from East Bank High School in the class of 1944. He was a member of the W.VA National Guard and was granted an honorable discharge to join the U S Navy.

He loved the water and could be found close by the Kanawha River during his youth.

The Navy took him to many places on heavy cruisers, oilers and submarines.

David qualified in submarines aboard the USS Cutlass (SS-478) in 1962. He retired as a MTC(SS) in 1969.

He then worked for General Dynamics as a test director and retired in 1993 as a senior logistics coordinator.

David was married to Lynn Ross Ferrell who predeceased him. He married to Mary Stone Georgi Ferrell, who survives. They met through mutual friends and were married in 1973, after the death of their former spouses.

Besides his wife he is survived by his sons, Donald and wife Debbie Ferrell of Bucksport, ME, Stephen and wife Barbara Ferrell of Ridgeville, S.C. a step son Henry Georgi of Groton, a step daughter Sharon Davis of Raynham, MA and a sister Phyliss Remmel and husband Steve of Clinton IN. Cold War Submariner John A. Slebodnick, 89, passed away the morning of September 11, 2019, at the Hillsborough County Nursing House.

Born in Hazleton, PA on July 17, 1930 to Andrew and Anna Slebodnick, John is survived by his wife of 65 years, Vassiliki (Tsiemkles) Slebodnick, his brother, James Slebodnick, his sister, Carol Czutno, his daughter-in-law, Lucie (Martin) Slebodnick, three grandchildren, Lauren, Andrew, and Jonathan and wife Charlotte, as well as one great grandchild, Theodore. He was predeceased by his son, John N. Slebodnick, who passed away in December 2017.

John was a 22-year Cold War Navy Veteran, reaching the position of Chief Petty Officer, and serving as Chief of The Boat on the USS Nautilus, the world's first operational nuclear -powered submarine and the first submarine to complete a submerged transit of the North Pole. He received a National Defense Service Medal with a Bronze Star and 5 Good Conduct Medals during his time in the service.

He qualified in submarines aboard USS Croaker (SSK-246) in 1955 and was a ICC when he retired from the Navy.

After a distinguished career in the Navy, he continued to work as an electrician, owning his own electrical company and teaching as a professor at NH Vocational Technical College (now Community College System of NH) in Manchester. In his free time, he enjoyed woodworking and bird watching.

Qualified in submarines on the USS Cochino (SS-345) in 1949 and was a LCDR when he left the Navy.

Cold War Submariner Paul Norman McGrath, LCDR, USN, Ret., passed away Sept. 6, 2019.

He was born May 18 1929, he lived in Whitehall, NY before joining the US Navy in 1946 as an enlisted man. He survived the sinking on the submarine USS Cochino (SS-345), which sank after a battery explosion off Norway on Aug. 26, 1949. (In the novel "Blind Man's Bluff" he is in the picture of the surviving crew, with the jacket marked ETC). He continued his Navy service in 1958 he was certified as a Navy Nuclear Operator (Certificate #4) and promoted to the Naval Officer ranks in the same year under Captain Hyman G. Rickover at the Naval Nuclear Training Station in West Milton, N.Y. Paul retired with 24 years of service as a Lieutenant Commander and wore both Enlisted (silver) and Officer (gold) Submarine Dolphins.

Paul continued his service as a technical assistant to Dr. D. Allan Bromley (5th director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy for George H. W. Bush) at Yale University's Sloane Physics Lab. During this time, Paul found and helped restored a Van de Graaff generator particle accelerator for physics research in Wright's lab basement.

Paul was a Life & Holland Club member of USSVI Groton Base, a member of B.P.O.E. Elks in Westbrook, he volunteered preparing and delivering Meals on Wheels in Clinton, was a member of the Choral Club of Clinton, and a member of the St. Mary's of the Visitation Catholic Church, as well as a member of the choir as a tenor.

Paul is survived by his wife of 70 years, Josephine A. McGrath; and his five sons, (all of which are military veterans) John, Richard, Robert, Gary, and Daniel; his sister Joann Niles; and bother Alan McGrath. He will be missed by his six grandchildren.

Old War Submariner Michael C. Doherty, Sr., 80, of Montville passed away at home Friday, Dec. 27, 2019, surrounded by and in the arms of his loving family. Mike was born in Boston, Mass, April 30, 1939. He was the oldest of six children, from an Irish family.

Mike graduated Boston Tech June 3, 1956 and joined the US Navy June 12, 1956 at age 17. Mike was stationed in Groton where he went to Sub School and then Nuclear Power School in Groton as well. Mike chose to stay and raise his family here in Connecticut. After an Honorable Discharge from the Submarine Service of the Navy, he began his lifelong love of learning by earning numerous degrees. He earned two associate degrees from Mitchell College, a Bachelor of Science Degree from UCONN in December 1982 - the same month his son received his BS. He finished up his higher education with a Master's Degree from the University of New Haven. He was always a wealth of information for anyone who needed it. Mike was also very involved in the community. When his children were young, he was President of the Uncasville PTA, President of the Montville Boosters, he coached Little League, he taught catechism, and much more where he made a tremendous impact on many.

He was a proud member of the US Sub Vets Holland Club, American Legion, the Elks and many other organizations. He was also very proud to be the co-founder of the first and only independent financial planning firm in Montville, which he opened with his son. Mike was very well liked by all who knew him. Friends from his children's school days referred to him as Mr. D and many viewed him as the community "Dad". He was always available for information and advice, a laugh and a hug, whichever was needed.

Mike met the love of his life, Joan (McAuley), when he was 8 years old, began dating in high school and married at 19 years of age. Mike and Joan recently celebrated their 61st wedding anniversary. They were married June 22, 1958, at Saint Angela's Roman Catholic Church in Mattapan, Mass. Mike leaves behind his wife, his son Michael and wife Karen; his daughter Karen and husband Raymond; and daughter Kathleen and husband Tom. He also leaves behind "Grandpa's Gang". What he called the most exculsive club - only requirement is to be one of his grandchildren. He sent every grandchild a letter when they were born welcoming them into "Grandpa's Gang". The members whom he was very proud of and adored more than anything, include Ryan Doherty, Caitlin Perkins, Kevin Doherty, Amanda Perkins, Alexandria Peck and Michaela Peck. Mike also leaves behind his brother John and wife Nancy; sister Kathleen and husband William; sister Maureen; and sister-in-law Patricia (Brian's wife). He is predeceased by his brother Peter and wife Linda and his brother Brian. Mike also leaves behind many nieces and nephews who truly loved their "Uncle Mike".

Mike was a Life and Holland Club member of USSVI Groton Base. Sailor, Rest your oar.

Joseph Allen Ashley, Machinist's Mate 2nd Class (SS) January 9, 2005

On 8 January 2005 at 02:43 GMT, the USS San Francisco (SSN-711) collided with an undersea mountain about 364 nautical miles southeast of Guam while operating at flank (maximum) speed at a depth of 525 feet. The collision was so serious that the vessel was almost lost—accounts detail a desperate struggle for positive buoyancy to surface after the forward ballast tanks were ruptured. Twenty-three crewmen were injured, and 24 year old Machinist's Mate Second Class Joseph Allen Ashley, of Akron, Ohio, died on 9 January from head injuries. Other injuries to the crew included broken bones, lacerations, and a back injury. San Francisco's forward ballast tanks and her sonar dome were severely damaged, but her inner hull was not breached, and there was no damage to her nuclear reactor. She surfaced and accompanied by the USCGC Galveston Island (WPB-1349), USNS GYSGT Fred W. Stockham (T-AK-3017), and USNS Kiska (T-AE-35), as well as MH-60S Knighthawks and P-3 Orion maritime patrol aircraft, arrived in Guam on January 10th.

I didn't know Joey Ashley, but he was a Submariner just like me and many of my Shipmates. The crew was just like the crew on every one of the 7 submarines I served on. Their efforts saved the USS SAN FRANCISCO and prevented further loss of life.

What happened to USS SAN FRANCISCO and MM2(SS) Ashley could have happened to me, or any one of us who wear the Dolphins and go down to the sea in vessels intentionally designed to sink. It's a dangerous business whether you are underway operating as the SAN FRANCISCO was, or sitting in a dry dock like the USS MIAMI was. There are reasons it is called "hazardous duty". We all know the hazards and risks every time we go on board, but we do it because that is the life we choose.

So on this anniversary of this tragic accident let us pause and remember Joey Ashley who gave his live while serving his country in Submarines. And let us all give thanks that we were fortunate that USS SAN FRANCISCO was not lost and that we are not remembering 127 men instead.

"There is a port of no return where ships may ride at anchor for a little space. And then some starless night the cable slips leaving only an eddy at the mooring place. Gulls veer no longer. Sailor rest your oar. No tangled wreckage will be washed ashore".

The nomination is accompanied by a letter from the Nominee indicating his willingness to accept the nomination and willingness to serve if elected. The Nomination Letter includes details of the nominee's qualifications in less than one hundred (100) words.

Dear Shipmate;

I am writing to you today sending this letter to you asking for your support for our Annual Appeal. As you know or may not you know, USSVI National is the sole owner of the Dominic "Joe" Negri Memorial Clubhouse at 40 School Street in Groton Connecticut. Groton Base, "First and Finest", was the number one base in the organization. This is where USSVI originated. Groton was also the home of USSVI Corporate Headquarters for the first 30 years when until the Board of Directors made a they a decision to move the National Office to moved to the West Coast. Groton Base has been the caretaker of the building and the land it sits on ever since.

Therefore, the purpose for this Annual Appeal is to help support the Dominic "Joe" Negri Memorial Clubhouse operating fund.

The Joe Negri Clubhouse was built in 1895, and at nearly 125-year-old the building requires a lot of tender loving care. Groton Base annual dues and donations simply aren't enough to meet the Clubhouse expenses. While Naturally our goal is to continue to provide the services to our members, but it has become harder for keeping the doors open. For example, the cost for utilities (electricity, heating oil and propane) is \$25,000 per year, building and other liability insurance costs \$15,000, and required maintenance another \$12,000 last year alone. has increased over the past years and Total expenses are is far greater than what we generate from member dues and donations.

The Dominic "Joe" Negri Memorial Clubhouse is the only tangible asset USSVI has owns, and because We are ALL members of USSVI. The building belongs to all of us!. We must depend on our membership to help in meeting our financial obligations and keeping our doors open to you, the owners of the building.
