Lost Boats – December



Lost on Dec 2, 1943 with the loss of 76 men. She was on her 1st war patrol, but her exact location, date and cause of loss remain a mystery. She may have been lost to mines or an operational casualty.



Lost on Dec 10, 1941 with the loss of 4 men. To prevent her from falling into enemy hands, she was scuttled in Manila Bay after incurring severe bomb damage during the initial Japanese attack. One other Sealion man was later captured and died in POW camp.



Lost on December 17, 1917 with the loss of 19 officers and men when it was sunk after collision with the USS F-3 (Pickerel(SS-22)) off San Clemente, CA.



Lost on December 17, 1927 with the loss of 40 officers and men when it was sunk after being rammed by USCG Paulding. Salvaged in 1928 and recommissioned.

Basic Enlisted Submarine School (BESS) Updates

During the month of November, a USSVI Groton Base member joined BESS graduation as the SubVets Representative presenting the "Heritage Award" to the class leader and a SubVet Challenge coin. In this month's issue of Boat Notes, we will highlight two graduations

on 3 & 17 November. I would like to thank SubSchool leadership for allowing us to participate.

The following information on the Submarine that the graduating class was named. This information provided here comes from various sources including Naval History and Heritage Command and Wikipedia. Follow the links for additional details.



On 5 October, the BESS class that graduated was named after the USS Silversides SS 236.

USS Silversides (SS/AGSS-236) is a Gato-class submarine, the first ship of the United States Navy to be named for the silversides.

Silversides was one of the most successful submarines in the Pacific Theater of World War II, with 23 confirmed sinkings, totaling more than 91,000 tons of shipping. She received a Presidential Unit Citation for cumulative action over four patrols, and twelve battle stars.

Her keel was laid down on 4 November 1940, by the Mare Island Navy Yard in Vallejo, California. She was launched on 26 August 1941, sponsored by Mrs. Elizabeth H. Hogan, and commissioned on 15 December 1941, with Lieutenant Commander Creed C. Burlingame in command. After shakedown off the California coast, Silversides set course for Hawaii, arriving at Pearl Harbor on 4 April 1942. Departing Pearl Harbor on 30 April, Silversides headed for the Japanese home islands, in the area of Kii Suido, for the first of her many successful war patrols.

She completed fourteen war patrols and received 12 battle stars and the Presidential Unit Citation for her war service. According to Joint Army-Navy Assessment Committee figures, Silversides was credited with sinking 23 enemy vessels for a total of 90,080 tons of enemy shipping.

After the war, Silversides set sail for New London, Connecticut, where she was decommissioned on 17 April 1946, and placed in reserve until 15 October 1947. She was then placed in service as a training ship for naval reservists at Chicago, Illinois, for the remainder of her service. Her name was stricken from the Navy list on 30 June 1969. The South Chicago Chamber of Commerce promptly applied to the U.S. Navy for custody of Silversides to preserve her as a memorial. In 1987, the submarine was moved to Muskegon, Michigan, to serve as the centerpiece of the Great Lakes Naval Memorial & Museum. Silversides is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and as a National Historic Landmark. The museum is now known as the USS Silversides Submarine Museum.

USS Silversides class # 23500 had 138 students with an 81% average and 16 graduated with distinction. This class of future Submariners have finished that first milestone in their Navy career and are anxiously



waiting for their next assignments, ranging from "A" School to direct assignment to their first submarine. Instructors for this were MMN2(SS) Curliss, ETN1(SS) Taylor, FT2(SS) Ballensky and STS1(SS) Kaytes. Thank you for using your background, training, and experience in training these future Submariners.

The Command Representative was SubSchool Executive Officer, CDR Hornung and Guest Speaker was MMACS(SS) Borchwell.



USSVI Groton Base, Holland Club and USSVI Life Member Gary Schmid was the SubVet representative presented the Submarine Heritage Award and a Groton Base challenge coin to FN(SU) Lillian Clunn. The Captain William H.



Purdum Award was presented to SR(SU) Nhurran Tolliver. The class Honor Graduate award was presented to SA(SU) SR(SU) Terje Snyder, and Navy Core Values Award was presented to FA(SU) Davian Strong. On November 17, the graduating BESS class was named after the USS Honolulu (SSN 718)

USS Honolulu (SSN-718) was a Los Angeles-class submarine, and the third ship of the United States Navy to be named for Honolulu, Hawaii. The contract to build her was awarded to Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company in Newport News, Virginia on 15 September 1977 and her keel was laid down on 10 November 1981. She was launched on 24 September 1983 sponsored by Mrs. Joan B. Clark, and commissioned on 6 July 1985, with Commander Robert M.

Mitchell in command.

Honolulu featured unique split stern planes that operated from independent hydraulic systems. With this redundant configuration, the inboard and outboard planes could be operated independently, preventing a failure of one or the other from causing an uncontrolled dive.


Honolulu's patrols were commemorated by ten surfboards signed by the men aboard her at the time. The latest three were kept on board the submarine; the other seven are stored at Pearl Harbor.

Honolulu held a farewell ceremony in Pearl Harbor on 15 April 2006, that included remarks by Senator Daniel K. Inouye, Lieutenant Governor Duke Aiona, U.S. Pacific Fleet commander Admiral Gary Roughead and former Honolulu commanding officer Vice Admiral Jonathan Greenert. Honolulu put to sea in early May 2006 for her final patrol. Her last patrol ended at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in October 2006 where she was placed on stand down, on her way to decommissioning. Honolulu, class # 24020 had 135 students with an 78% average with 8 graduating with distinction. These future Submariners have finished that first significant milestone in their Navy career and are anxiously waiting for their next assignments, ranging from "A" School to direct assignment to their first submarine. Running this class through their paces were instructors MMN(SS) Hudson, FT2(SS) Jensen, and FT2(SS) Rodrigue. Thank you for using your background, training, and experience in training these future Submariners.

Travis Speaker, COB of PCU Idaho. SubSchool Chaplain, LT Levels gave the Invocation and Benediction.

THE CHAPEL ON THE THAMES

The Chapel on the Thames (COT) is located aboard Naval Submarine Base New London in Groton and offers both Protestant and Roman Catholic worship services for active duty, retired veterans, and their families.

The COT was originally conceived and constructed as a memorial to submariners, officers and enlisted, who lost their lives in the service of their country during the Second World War. It was dedicated 79 years ago on December 3, 1944, and in it you will find many submarine related themes, including beautiful stained-glass windows and pews labeled with brass plates to memorialize specific submarines from World War II.

All with base access are welcome to participate in scheduled services, which are on Sundays as follows: Protestant Service at 9:30 AM and Roman Catholic Mass at 11:30 AM. COT is located directly across the parking lot from Dealey Center movie theater. We hope you will take the time to visit us at this historic chapel."
